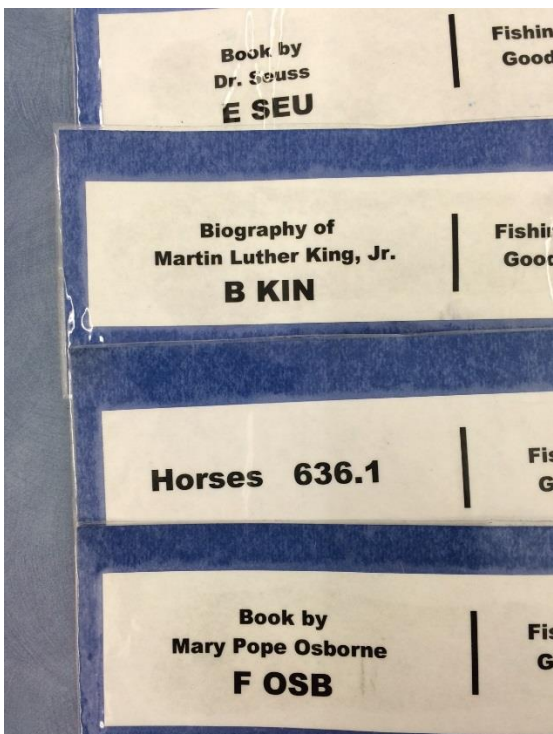


CALL NUMBER LOCATION ACTIVITIES

Fishing for call numbers (3rd grade) – General subjects and authors, not specific titles. Multiple correct answers. “Fishing for a good book.”



Library Scavenger Hunt (4th grade) – Choose books from fiction, nonfiction, biography, and everybody sections. Students are looking for a specific title. I try to choose books with multiple copies or that aren't extremely popular. I do check the shelves before beginning this activity and pull cards if titles are checked out.
